The Parish Council wondered if we could make better use of the old phone box in Dodford Road, which was overgrown with weeds and rarely used. We asked BT and they were happy to allow it be used to house a defibrillator and will continue to pay for the electricity supply needed to keep the battery ticking over.

Search for a parish councillor...

There is currently a vacant seat on the parish council. Bournheath Parish Council was established in 1994 with seven members, all of whom volunteer for the role. Elections are held every four years for residents in the parish to appoint members to the council and there was an election earlier this year, in May, to choose the seven members from a pool of eight candidates.

Due to a variety of reasons and changes to work schedule, one of those elected in May has resigned from the role thus creating a vacancy. Public notices were displayed on the notice boards and on the website providing an opportunity for any elector who so wished to call for a byelection. As there has been no such request, the parish council is now free to co-opt a suitable candidate.

In brief parish councillors serve their community by providing a variety of services that complement those provided by district and county councils. Here in Bournheath we oversee the Lengthsman scheme, provide dogwaste bags at the playing field, support the village hall committee, plant spring bulbs, respond to planning application consultations, take part in the Parish Footpath scheme, liaise with parish stake holders such as the police, district and county representatives, and take steps to improve the environment where possible.

Little donkey


Little donkey, little donkey,
